2. The Village's Annual State Report (AUD) for FYE May 31, 2021, was electronically filed with the Office of the State Comptroller on August 31. The report is available in my office for your review. I have begun working on the Financial Statements (GASB 34).
3. Through close of business September 3, we had collected \$5,889,999, approximately 92.69% of the total adjusted tax warrant of \$6,316,652, slightly ahead of last year (91.54%). The last day for collection in the Village Office will be September 30.

WHEREAS, the Village of Massena and Town of Massena, jointly, were awarded a Citizens Reorganization Empowerment Grant from NYS Department of State for a Village and Town of Massena Consolidation Study and Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Village and Town of Massena, jointly, awarded funding to Center for Governmental Research ("CGR") and, jointly, appointed a "Re-Organization Study Committee" comprised of citizens of the Town and Village of Massena to perform study; and

WHEREAS, CGR and the Re-Organization Study Committee submitted a Village of Massena Reorganization Study Assessment of Fiscal and Service Impacts and presented findings at a joint meeting with both the Village and Town of Massena later adopting the study as completed; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED; that the Village of Massena Board of Trustees, as recently recommended by CGR, hereby abolishes and terminates the Village of Massena Justice Court at the conclusion of the current justice's elected term; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED; that the Village of Massena Board of Trustees respectfully requests the assistance of the Village Justice Court personnel, the Town Council and the Town Justice Court office in effecting an orderly transition of the consolidation of the Village Court into the Town Court.

SUMMARY OF REFUNDING BOND RESOLUTION DATED SEPTEMBER 15, 2020.

SUMMARY OF A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE PURSUANT TO SECTION 90.00 OF THE LOCAL FINANCE LAW OF REFUNDING BONDS OF THE VILLAGE OF MASSENA, ST. LAWRENCE COUNTY, NEW YORK, TO BE DESIGNATED SUBSTANTIALLY "PUBLIC IMPROVEMENT REFUNDING (SERIAL) BONDS", AND PROVIDING FOR OTHER MATTERS IN RELATION THERETO AND THE PAYMENT OF THE BONDS TO BE REFUNDED THEREBY.

WHEREAS, the Village of Massena, St. Lawrence County, New York (hereinafter, the "Village") heretofore issued serial bonds in 2007; and

WHEREAS, it would be in the public interest to refund all or a portion of the outstanding principal balance of the Refunded Bonds maturing in 2021 and thereafter by the issuance of refunding bonds pursuant to Section 90.00 of the Local Finance Law; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Massena, St. Lawrence County, New York, as follows:

Section 1. For the object or purpose of refunding the outstanding principal balance of the Refunded Bonds, including providing moneys which, together with the interest earned from the investment of certain of the proceeds of the refunding bonds herein authorized, shall be sufficient to pay (i) the principal amount of the Refunded Bonds, (ii) the aggregate amount of unmatured interest payable on the Refunded Bonds to and including the date on which the Refunded Bonds which are callable are to be called prior to their respective maturities in accordance with the refunding financial plan, as hereinafter defined, (iii) the costs and expenses incidental to the issuance of the refunding bonds herein author-

ized, and (iv) the premium or premiums for a policy or policies of municipal bond insurance or cost or costs of other credit enhancement facility or facilities, for the refunding bonds herein authorized, or any portion thereof, there are hereby authorized to be issued refunding serial bonds of the Village in an amount not to exceed \$1,200,000 pursuant to the provisions

of Section 90.00 of the Local Finance Law (the "Refunding Bonds"), it being anticipated that the amount of Refunding Bonds actually to be issued will be approximately \$1,155,000, as provided in Section 4 hereof.

Section 2. The Refunding Bonds may be subject to redemption prior to maturity upon such terms as the Village Treasurer shall prescribe, which terms shall be in compliance with the requirements of Section 53.00 (b) of the Local Finance Law.

Section 3. It is hereby determined that:

(a) the maximum amount of the Refunding Bonds authorized to be issued pursuant to this resolution does not exceed the limitation imposed by Section 90.00 of the Local Finance Law;

(b) the maximum period of probable usefulness permitted by law at the time of the issuance of the Refunded Bonds for each object or purpose for which such Refunded Bonds were issued is as specified in the Refunded Bond Certificate which is incorporated herein by reference (available for inspection at the office of the Village Clerk during normal business hours);

(c) the last installment of the Refunding Bonds will mature not later than the expiration of the period of probable usefulness of the specific object or purpose for which said Refunded Bonds were issued in accordance with Section 90.00 of the Local Finance Law;

(d) the estimated present value of the total debt service savings anticipated as a result of the issuance of the Refunding Bonds computed in accordance with the provisions of subdivision 2 of paragraph b of Section 90.10 of the Local Finance Law, with regard to the Refunded Bonds, is \$210,084, as shown in the Refunding Financial Plan described in Section 4 hereof.

Section 4. The financial plan for the refunding authorized by this resolution (the "Refunding Financial Plan"), showing the sources and amounts of all moneys required to accomplish such refunding are set forth in Exhibit A to the Complete Resolution which Exhibit A is not published as part of this summary. The Refunding Financial Plan has been prepared based upon the assumption that the Refunding Bonds will be issued in a single series to refund all of the Refunded Bonds in the principal amount of \$1,155,000, and that the Refunding Bonds will mature, be of such terms, and bear interest as set forth on said Exhibit A.

Section 5. The faith and credit of said Village of Massena, St. Lawrence County, New York, are hereby irrevocably pledged to the payment of the principal of and interest on the Refunding Bonds as the same respectively become due and payable. An annual appropriation shall be made in each year sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds becoming due and payable in such year. There shall be annually levied on all the taxable real property in said Village a tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such Refunding Bonds as the same become due and payable.

Section 6. The Refunding Bonds shall be sold at private or public sale as shall be determined by the Village Treasurer.
